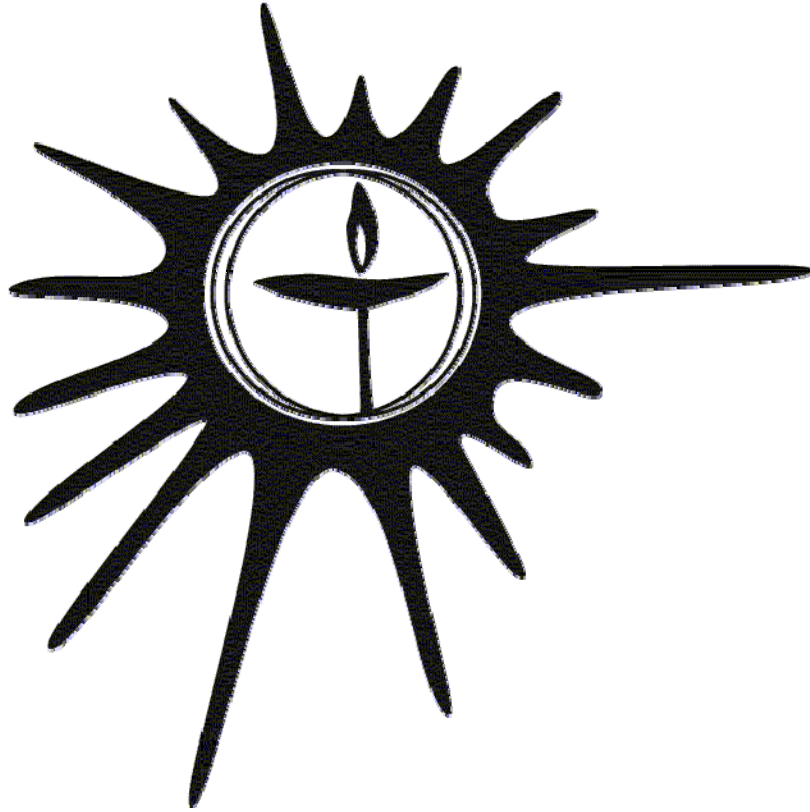

“ENGAGE – CONNECT – COMMIT”: The Second report of Your Ministerial Search Committee

The search committee met on August 2nd, 2010 and discussed the more immediate feedback to the questions below. More feedback is welcomed.

We also planned for the upcoming cottage meetings on August 8th and 15th. These meetings will be in the Sanctuary shortly after the Service.

It is vital to our deliberations that we hear from all stakeholders at GUUF. Therefore, I call upon you to ENGAGE in dialogue, CONNECT with one another on this matter, and COMMIT to being at the Cottage meetings.

The Committee has formulated five main questions below (with some subparts) to put forth to the Congregation in furtherance of their work.

All comments must be received from the congregation no later than 8/15/2010 so the Committee can assemble the information and make its initial recommendation(s) to the Congregation by the end of August on the issue of whether the Committee will recommend calling Pat Jobe or going into a full UUA search.

The next meeting of the Ministerial Search Committee will be 8/16/2010 at 6:00 p.m.

Please feel free to share your thoughts on these issues with any member of the Ministerial Search Committee in person, via email, or through the email address SearchComm@GreenvilleUU.org (which will forward the email to each member of the search committee).

The questions:

1. What are the most important qualities that you desire in minister?
2. What are traditional duties of a minister that are not as important to you? (For example, staff management, pastoral care giving, leader of Sunday Services, community involvement, or education about UU)
3. How important is it to you that a minister have a Master of Divinity degree?
4. How important is it to you that a minister have been trained at a UU Divinity School?
5. What are your views of Rev. Pat Jobe? (Please discuss)
What do you see as Rev. Jobe's strengths?
What do you see as Rev. Jobe's areas for improvement?

Fellowship Photo Directory Options

Finally the new Fellowship Color Photo Directory is completed and ready for distribution. It seems that we manage to get a photo directory about every 10 years. It may be several more years before everyone is ready to have their photos updated and the next complete hardcopy photo directory will be available for print.

However, for the first time we now have the option to update the electronic photo directory several times a year.

There are four options for the Photo Directory

- #1. Only accept the electronic copy and save the Fellowship work, money, and save a tree. More individuals are going to a paperless system.
- #2. Spiral binder version. It lays flat and looks nice. The disadvantage is there is no capability to add extra sheets of information and photos of new friends and members that could be added to the back of a 3-ring binder. Due to budgetary constraints, the Fellowship cannot provide 3-ring binders.
- #3. Three-hole punch directories can have additional information added. Friends and members may want to insert new photos of friends and members which can be printed and distributed and placed in the back of the directory.
- #4. Unpunched directories do not have holes in the pages and can be held together with a plastic strip clip. If used often the pages may bend and it cannot lay flat. However, new pages can be added as needed.

This is not just a walk fundraiser, it's an educational tour, too. You'll travel the same route (approximately 4 miles) that

your homeless and less fortunate neighbors take when seeking assistance from human services agencies. We will begin and end at Fluor Field (Greenville Drive Stadium) at the Field Street entrance. The Walk begins at 2:00 pm, but we recommend you arrive by 1:30 pm to check in. You may park at County Square on University Ridge and ride the trolley to the stadium.

In addition to supporting the Walk through fundraising, you may also donate shelter supplies or non-perishable food. We will have bins at the stadium to collect toiletries, laundry detergent, new-in-package men's and women's underwear (size 34 and medium respectively), and food such as canned meats, dry beans and peanut butter.

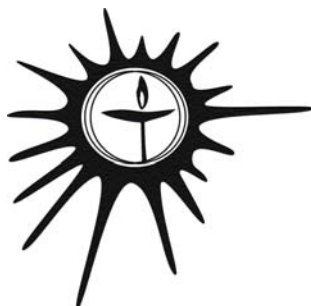
