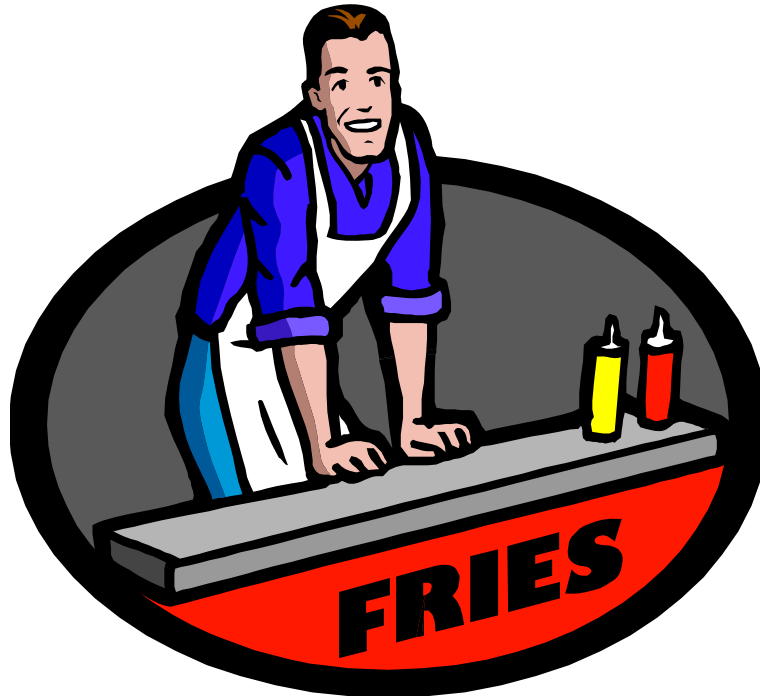

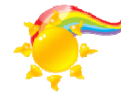

## Get Geared Up and Read to WALK Sunday October 17<sup>th</sup> 2010 at 2 pm



This is not just a walk fundraiser, it's an educational tour, too. You'll travel the same route (approximately 4 miles) that

your homeless and less fortunate neighbors take when seeking assistance from human services agencies. We will begin and end at Fluor Field (Greenville Drive Stadium) at the Field Street entrance. The Walk begins at 2:00 pm, but we recommend you arrive by

1:30 pm to check in. You may park at County Square on University Ridge and ride the trolley to the stadium.

In addition to supporting the Walk through fundraising, you may also donate shelter supplies or non-perishable food. We will have bins at the stadium to collect toiletries, laundry detergent, new-in-package men's and women's underwear (size 34 and medium respectively), and food such as canned meats, dry beans and peanut butter. **See Rev.
